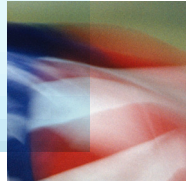
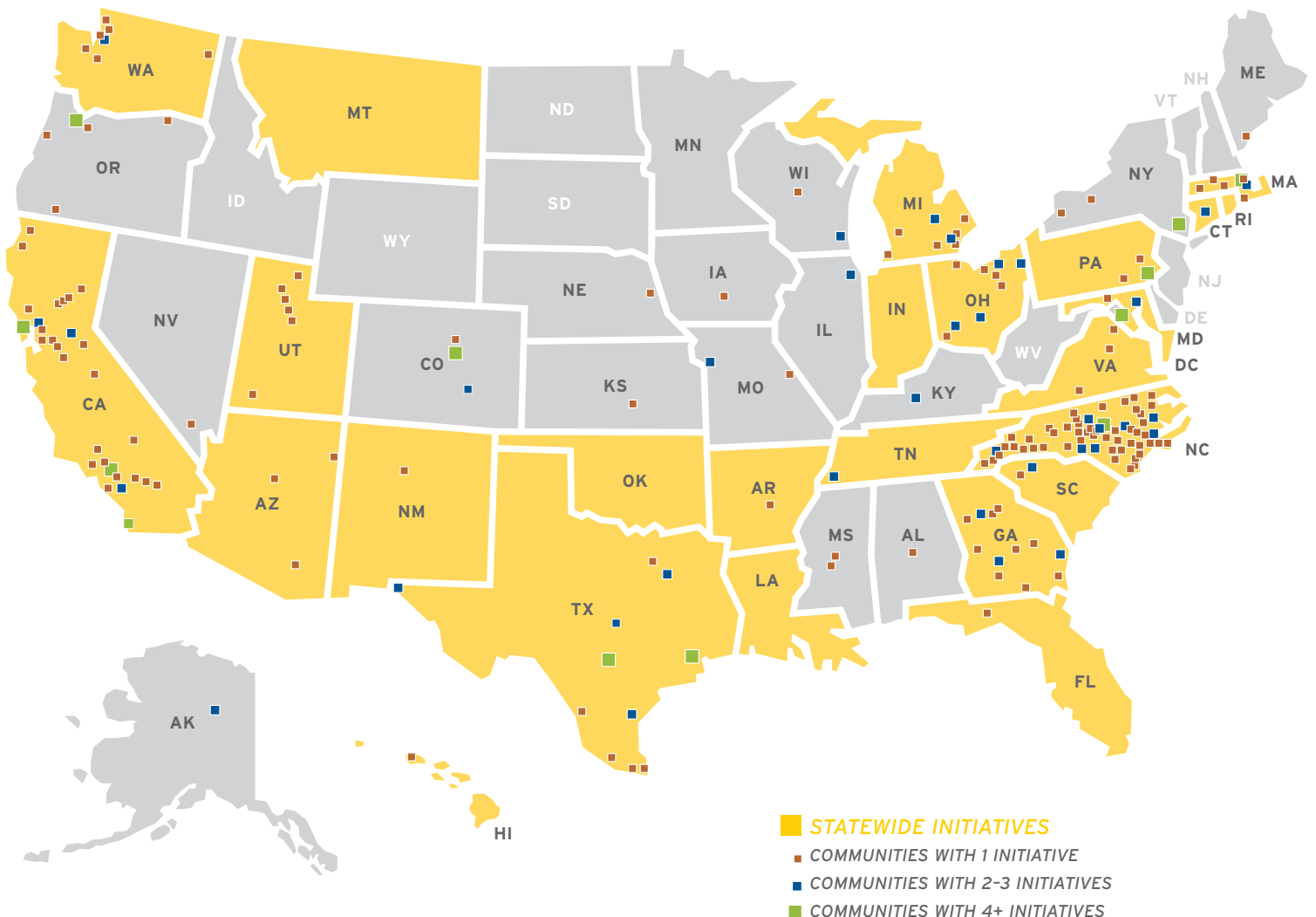

JFF's national initiatives serve in-school students, out-of-school youth, and working adults who need multiple pathways to advance their learning and their careers. Our successes prove that dramatic change is possible when good ideas have room to grow—and when change leads to a stronger, more productive nation.



**ACHIEVING THE DREAM:** Helping community college students earn valued credentials and using data to track and ensure student success at more than 100 colleges in 16 states.



**BREAKING THROUGH:** Enabling adults with little education to prepare for and succeed in college technical programs at 33 community colleges in 18 states.



**COLLEGE PRODUCTIVITY:** Increasing the number of college graduates within available resources and while preserving instructional quality.



**CONNECTED BY 25:** Working with states, cities, and national youth networks to ensure that dropouts and other struggling youth not only earn their high school degrees but advance to higher education and careers.



**CONNECTING LITERACY AND WORK:** Advancing low-skilled adults in their careers by linking adult literacy programs to workforce initiatives in 5 communities.



**EARLY COLLEGE HIGH SCHOOL INITIATIVE:** Creating schools that help underrepresented youth earn a high school diploma and one to two years of college credit—tuition free.
